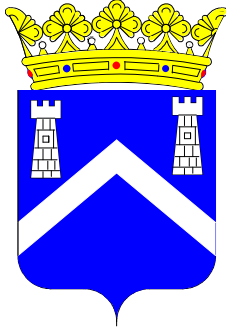


## Almazán de Saint Priest

**Principal Title :** Duchess of Almazán de Saint Priest.

**Creation :** Spain, 1830.

**Subsidiary Titles :** Grandee of Spain.

**Family Name :** de Castellane y Boisgelin.

**Family History :** A certain François de Guignard de Saint Priest, having already received Honours at the Court, was created an hereditary peer in 1815. This was followed by the rank of Count, in 1817, and a few months later by the honour of Count-Peer. This was conditional on a promise of a *majorat* being established..

His son, Louis, was entered into the ranks of Grandees of Spain (second class) with the title of Duke of Almazán, in Spain in 1830. This line became extinct in 1900.

However, in 1993 Louis Boniface de Castellane successfully petitioned for the duchy to be restored in his favour. He died a few years later and has been succeeded by his daughter.
