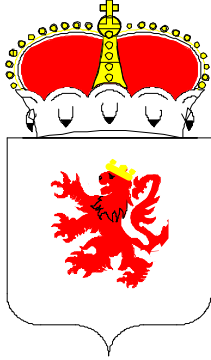


Auersperg-Trautson



Description of Arms :

D'argent au lion de gueules, couronné d'or.

Strictly, only the senior branch bears this simplified coat-of-arms

Principal Title : Prince von Auersperg-Trautson.

Creation : Holy Roman Empire, 1746.

Subsidiary Titles : Count of Gottschee and Wels, Lord of Schörnberg and Seissenberg.

Family Name : von Auersperg-Trautson

Family History : This is the second main line of this distinguished family, which dates back to the XIII century in Carniola.

It can be traced back to Vincenz, whose short life was between 1790 and 1812. At the age of five, he succeeded his cousin, Count Johann Adam, who died in 1795 without direct heirs.

The rest of the family history can be seen under the senior line.

The Auersperg-Trautson branch did receive the dignity of Prince of the Holy Roman Empire but this applies only to male primogeniture. In default, the title returns to the main branch. This seems unlikely, for the time being.
