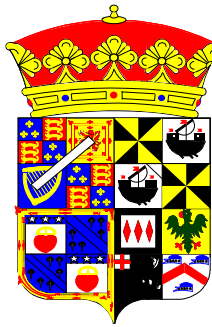


Buccleuch and Queensberry

Description of Arms :



Quartely : 1st *grandquarter for the Earldom of Doncaster*, quartely (i) and (iv) azure, 3 fleurs-de-lys or ; (ii) and (iii) gules, 3 lions passant guardant in pale or ; 2nd, or, a lion rampant gules within a double tressure flory-counter-flory of the second ; 3rd, azure, a harp or ; all debriused by a baton sinister argent ; 2nd *grandquarter for the Dukedom of Argyll*, quartely, 1st and 4th, gyrony of 8 or and sable (Campbell) ; 2nd and 3rd, argent, a lymphad, sails furled sable, flags and pennons flying gules, and oars in action of the second (Lorne) ; 3rd *grandquarter for the Dukedom of Queensberry*, quartely, 1st and 4th, argent, a human heart gules, crowned with an imperial crown or, on a chief azure 3 mullets of the field (Douglas) ; 2nd and 3rd, azure, a bend between 6 cross crosslets fitchee or (Mar) ; the whole of this granquarter within a border or, charged with a double tressure flory-counter-flory gules ; 4th *granquarter for the Dukedom of Montagu*, quartely, 1st argent, 3 fusils conjoined in fess gules, a bordure sable (Montagu) ; 2nd, or, an eagle displayed vert, beaked and membered gules (Monthermer) ; 3rd, sable, a lion rampant argent, on a canton of the last a cross gules (Churchill) ; 4th, argent, a chevron gules between 3 caps-of-maintenance, their fronts turned to the sinister azure, furred ermine (Brudenell) ; over the grandquarters, at the fess point an inescutcheon or, on bend azure, a mullet of 6 points between 2 crescents of the field (Scott).

Principal Title : Duke of Buccleuch and of Queensberry.

Creation : Peerage of Scotland : Buccleuch in 1663, and Queensberry in 1683.

Subsidiary Titles : Marquis of Dumfriesshire (1706), Earl of Drumlanrig and Sanquhar (1706), Earl of Buccleuch (1619), Earl of Doncaster (1663) and Earl of Dalkeith (1663), Viscount Nith, Thorthorwald and Ross (1706), Lord Douglas of Kinmont, Middebie and Dornoch (1706), Lord Scott of Buccleuch (1606), Lord Scott of Whitchester and Eskdail (1619), and Baron Scott of Tynedale (1663).

Family Name : Montagu Douglas Scott.

Family History : The complexity of the coat-of-arms and the accumulation of titles give some idea of the age and distinction of this family. In fact it is the accumulation of several families, as the name indicates.

It goes back six centuries to Sir Richard le Scot of Rankilburn and Murthockstone. From there on it is probably easiest to follow the genealogical tree, below. It has always played an important part in Scottish affairs; made all the more interesting by its huge land holdings in that county and the fact that important Scottish lords tend to stay at home (when they are not fighting).

So distinguished has it been, in fact, that there have been several marriages between the Scotts and the Royal Family.
