


## **Croy-Roeulx**

### **Belgian Branch 1**



#### *Description of Arms :*

D'argent à trois fasce de gueules.  
ou  
fascé d'argent et de gueules de huit pièces.

**Principal Title :** Prince of Croy-Solré..

**Creation :** Various, see text.

**Subsidiary Titles :** As above.

**Family Name :** de Croy or Croÿ, de Croy-Solré, de Croy-Roeulx.

**Family History :** This family has taken up residence in various parts of Europe and is often referred to by the country in which they are mainly associated.

This line descends from the second son of August, 1765-1822, and has itself subdivided into two other branches. This, the senior of the Belgian lines is usually listed as Croy-Roeulx. Roeulx being their main residence.

However, in 1933 in Belgium, they were confirmed in the style of Prince of Croy-Solré, with the qualification of Serene Highness. The principality of Solré, actually in northern France, dates from the Spanish rule of the Low Countries and from its elevation in 1677.
