Description of Arms :

1 - Argent, a griffon salient gules.
2 - Per fess Or and argent, in chief the Russian Imperial Eagle, triple coronated, charged with the Cyrillic letter "P" between in pale the Royal Crown and the figure "1" , signifying His Majesty Emperor Paul the First proper ; and in the base a griffon salient gules.

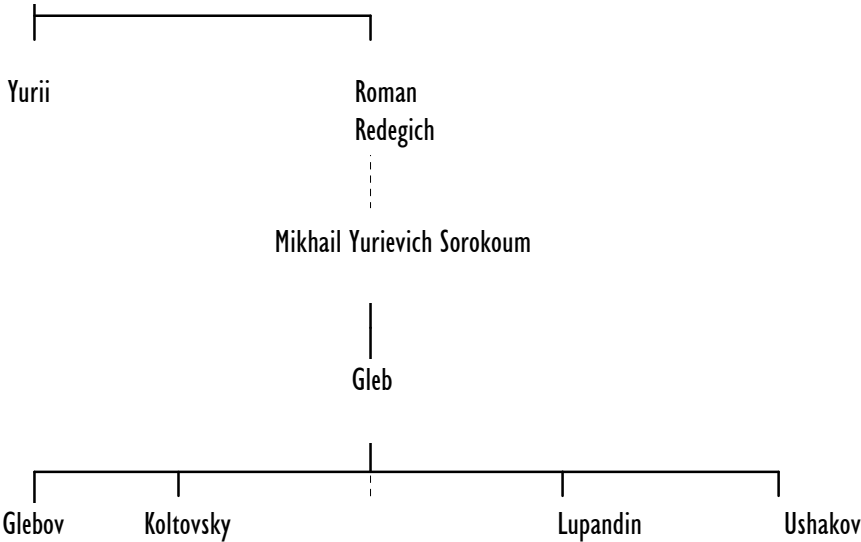
Family History :

1- The Great Prince Msitslav of Tmutarakan, son of the Great Prince Vladimir Sviatoslavich, the Christianizer of Russia, conquered the Kasog Prince Redebia (Redega) and assumed all of his wealth and imposed a tribute on Kasogia. The children of Prince Redebia, who were named after baptism Yurii and Roman, were servitors to the Great Prince. The great-grandson of Roman Redegich, Mikhail Yurievich Sorokoum, had a son, Gleb, and from him are descended the following families : Glebov, Koltovsky, Lupandin, and Ushakov. The great-grandson of Gleb Mikhailovich, Varfolomei Grigorievich called Lapot, had a son, Vasilii Lopukha, whose descendants, the Lopukhin family, served the Throne in ancient as well as in more recent times in noble positions and were granted fiefdoms and other honors and tokens of the Monarch's favor. A descendant of this family Evdokia Feodorovna, daughter of Feodor Avraamovich Lopukhin, was the spouse of His Highness Emperor Peter the Great.

2- Petr Vasilievich Lopukhin descended from an ancient and noble family. By order of Emperor Peter the Great on January 19, 1799 he was graciously named Prince of the Russian Empire together with all of his descendants and was granted the title of Most Illustrious Prince.
