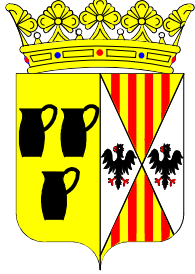


# Monteleón



## *Description of Arms :*

Escudo partido : 1º, en campo de oro, tres "pignates" de sable, bien ordenados ; 2º, las de la Casa Real de Aragon.

**Principal Title :** Duke of Monteleón.

**Creation :** Spain, 1527.

**Subsidiary Titles :** Count of Fuentes (1508), Grandee of Spain.

**Family Name :** Pignatelli de Aragon y Burgos.

**Family History :** This family goes back to the XII Century and has divided its time between Naples and Spain. The original title was created in favour of don Hector Pignatelli y Carafa, Count of Monteleón and Vice-Roy of Sicily and Catalonia. The Pignatelli family, one of the most illustrious ever, is covered elsewhere under its various branches; the Carafa can be found under Rocella.

Don Hector Pignatelli was already a count when he was raised to the rank of duke. The title was restored in 1893, with the rank of Grandee of Spain, in favour of doña Maria del Rosario Pérez de Barradas y Fernández de Córdoba.
