


Elchingen



Description of Arms :

D'or à l'écusson d'azur chargé d'une orle et accostée de 2 mains tenant des badelaires et adossées de sable, à la bordure d'azur et au chef brochant des Ducs (càd de gueules semé d'étoiles d'argent) ou de Princes de l'Empire (càd d'azur semé d'abeilles d'or).

Principal Title : Duke of Elchingen.

Creation : French Empire, 1808.

Subsidiary Titles : Prince of Moskowa (1812/3).

Family Name : Ney d'Elchingen de La Moskowa.

Family History : Michel Ney, one of Napoleon's *Maréchaux*, was known as "the bravest of the brave".

He was created Duke d'Elchingen in 1808 though this was not confirmed until 1826. He was also created Prince de la Moscova (Moscow) on the day of the battle in 1812. This was confirmed a few months later. He became a Peer of France in 1814.

He was executed before a firing squad after the Hundred Days. However, the family was re-recognised in 1848.

The title became extinct, in 1869, with the death of the 6th and last Duke and Prince.
