


## Faucigny-Lucinge



### *Description of Arms :*

Parti : au 1, palé d'or et de gueules, qui est Faucigny ; au 2, bandé de gueules et d'argent, qui est de Lucinge.

**Principal Title :** Prince of Faucigny-Lucinge.

**Creation :** By tradition.

**Subsidiary Titles :** Count, *Cousin du Roi* (1829), Prince of Cystria (a title awarded or confirmed by the King of Sardinia, 1794).

**Family Name :** Faucigny-Lucinge.

**Family History :** This line comes from the Sires de Lucinge, in Savoy, mentioned in 960. The family can trace its origing, with certainty, as far back as 1083. Long settled in France, they received several honours, mounting to the title of count in 1787. However, they had always claimed the title of prince and the right to be known as such, in France, was confirmed by King Charles X in 1828. The following year, they became one of the very exclusive band known as cousins of the king, with right to enter the Louvre. Authorisation was also accorded to resurrect the ancient title of Prince of Cystria, by order of promogeniture. This, originally Sardinian style, was further confirmed by letters-patent, in 1794 by the King of Sardinia and again, in 1920, by Victor Emmanuel III as King of Italy.

This is one of those occasions when a title is so old that no real documentation exists and so is described, by your editors, as being "by tradition". It has just been there as long as memory goes back.
