


Infantado



Description of Arms :

As shown or:

Principal Title : Duke del Infantado.

Creation : Spain, 1475.

Subsidiary Titles : Marquis de Santillana (1445), de Ariza (1829) y de Távora (1541), Count de la Monclova (1617), Marquis de Armunia (1624), de Cea (1599) y de Valmediano (1692), Count de Corres (1773), del Real de Manzanares (1445), de Saldana (1479) y de Santagio (1862), Grandee of Spain.

Family Name : de Arteaga y Martin.

Family History : This is one of the oldest European titles, dating back to 1475. It was created in favour of the Mendoza family and the Duke del Infantado was one of the original twenty-five Grantees, elevated in 1520 by Charles Quint. The first recipient of the honour was don Diego Hurtado de Mendoza.

From there the duchy passed, by virtue of inheritance, into the hands of the Sandoval family, which also held the dukedom of Lerma. From there it went to the family de Silva, Dukes of Pastrana ; then to the Toledo family, Marquises of Távara ; then to the Giróns, Dukes d'Osuna and then, finally, into the family d'Arteaga, Marquises of Valmediano - where it now remains.
