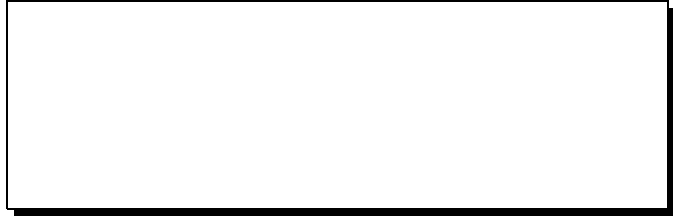


# Ahumada

*Description of Arms :*



**Principal Title :** Duke of Ahumada.

**Creation :** Spain, 1836.

**Subsidiary Titles :** Marquis de las Amarillas (1747), Grandee of Spain.

**Family Name :** Chico de Guzman y Giron.

**Family History :** The family of Girón is one of the oldest there is, going back to the XII Century. But it was not until 1836 that they achieved the rank of duke; the title being created in favour of don Pedro Girón de las Casas, Moctezuma y Aragonri, who was marquis de las Amarillas. He was also prominent in political affairs and was Minister of War. In 1912, the title passed into the great Guzmán family. From there, it fell into disuetude but was reassumed in 1974..

Spanish names may seem very complicated to the outsider but they do tell a story. The name of the mother is generally added on to that of the father and so a more complete picture can be arrived at.
