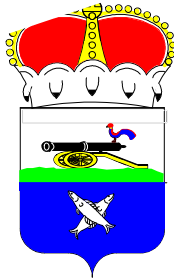


Aladin Aladyne



Description of Arms :

Per fess argent and a river proper, in chief on a terrasse averdant a cannon proper, mounted or, and perched thereon on the sinister end of the chamber a bird of paradise proper, and in base in saltire two fishes haurient of the first.

Principal Title : Prince Aladin.

Creation : By tradition.

Family Name : Aladin or Aladyne.

Family History : By tradition , this family goes back to Leo "Oladia" Danilovich Monastirev, who was living in the XV Century. But as those familiar with Russian coats of arms, Leo goes back much further than that. To, in fact, St Vladimir Sviatoslavich, the Christianiser of Russia. In this case, through the line that rules Smolensk but, also, through the rulers of Kiev. There is also a record of Nikita Vasilievich Aladin being in the service of Tsar Mikhail Fedorovich as a Regimental Voïvode in several cities. As a reward, he was awarded estates. There are further records of members of the family serving as *Stolniks* and *Striapchii* and in other noble posts.

This particular branch is believed to have become extinct.
