### *Description of Arms :*

Curtelado : 1° y 4°, en campo de oro, cuatro palos, de gules, y 2° y 3°, en campo de gules, una cadena, puesta en orla, aspa y cruz de plata.

**Principal Title :** Duke de Aliaga.

**Creation :** Spain (Aragon), 1487.

**Subsidiary Titles :** Grandee of Spain.

**Family Name :** Martinez de Irujo y Fitz-James Stuart.

**Family History :** As the date of creation shows, this is a very old title indeed. It started life in the House of Hajar, a natural issue of James I, King of Aragon. The head of the family was elevated to the rank of duke, in 1487 and then, some time later, with the style of Grandee of Spain. It should be mentioned that the original recipient was already Baron de Hajar ( from 1268 ) and Count de Aliaga, from 1461. He was don Juan Fernández de Hajar y Cabrera.

In the XVII Century, the dukedom passed into the Sarmiento family, Counts of Salinas and Ribadeo, Marquisses de Alenquer. From there, in due course, it found itself a new home with the de Silva Marquisses of Orani.

The family name indicates that the present holder of the title, don Alfonso, married into the House of Alba.
