Principal Title : Duke of Amalfi.

Creation : Spain, 1642.

Subsidiary Titles : Marquis of Orellana la Vieja (1646), Grandee of Spain.

Family Name : Seoane y Cotoner.

Family History : This was originally a title from the Kingdom of the Two Sicilies and Amalfi, itself, was a town of enormous historical interest. The original dukedom died out but, in 1642, it was recreated in favour don Ottavio Piccolomini de Aragon. The Piccolomini family, it is worth noting, was one of the great names to come from Siena and gave to the Church Pope Pius II.

Don Ottavio was born in Pisa in 1600 but then became a general in the Austrian Army. He distinguished himself at the battle of Lützen (1632) when he was only thirty-two years old. This followed up by further successes at Nördlingen (1643) and Thionville in Lorraine (1639). He died at the comparatively young age of fifty-six but he had, by then, been rewarded for his victoires with the dukedom of Amalfi.

It did not remain all that long in this family; in 1902, it passed into that of Fuster, Counts of Roches, and then, in 1914, into that Zayas, Marquises of Cavascelici.

It is now entrenched in the family of Seone by virtue of a marriage with the Cotoner family.
