Quartely : 1) azure, a deecrescent argent ensigned with a croisette patty Or ; 2) argent, the letter "A" ensigned with the point of an arrow sable ; 3) Or, on a shield (sic) in bend a lion statant sable ; 4) gules, in bend sinister, its point downward, a sword argent.

Family History : The family of Princes Babichev is descended fom the Princes of Ostrog. In Russian hiqstory, in the genealogical books, and in the Polish chronicle of Matvei Strikovsky it is shown that the descendant of the Great Prince Vladimir Sviatoslavich, the Christianizer of Russia, Prince Daniil Romanovich, had a son, Prince Lev Danilovich, who, after the death of his uncle, Prince Vasilii Romanovich, inherited the Principality of Galich and founded the City of Lvov, and afterward was Prince of Kiev, Zvenigorod, Podgorod, Galich, Vladomir, and Ostrog, and from him are descended the Princes of Ostrog and Iziaslav. A descendant of the Princes of Ostrog, Prince Semen Dmitrievich Baba, had a son, Ivan. In Russian history it is shown that the Prince of Lithuania, Votovt, sent Prince Ivan Baba and his brother, Prince Ivan Putiata, to the Great Prince Vasilii Dmitrievich with an army to fight against the Tatar Prince Kundak. From Prince Ivan Baba are descended the Princes Babichev and from Prince Putiata the Princes Putiatin. The great-grandson of Prince Ivan Baba, Prince Dmitrii Yurievich, was granted fiefdoms by the Great Princes Vasilii Vasilievich and Ioann Vasilievich. Prince Vasilii Andreevich bbichev in 1680 and 1690 was granted fiefdoms and charters for them by the Great Princes and tsars Aleksei Mikhailovich, Feodor Alekseevich, and Petr Alekseevich for his service and valor.
