


Boiano



Description of Arms :

Partito : al 1° d'azzurro alla fascia d'oro, accompagnata da quattro rose al naturale, tre in capo, ordinate in fascia e sormontate ognuna da un giglio d'oro e una punta (Perrellii) ; al 2° di verde a tre bande di rosso, orlate d'argento (Filomarino) ; il tutto accollato all'aquila bicipite dell'Impero.

Principal Title : Prince of Boiano.

Family Name : Perrelli Tomacelli Filomarino.

Family History : This old family goes back, at least to the XIII Century. It was confirmed on the list of Neapolitan nobles, in 1536, when the Emperor Charles Quint also gave permission to display one their coat of arms the eagle of the Holy Roman Empire.

At the beginning of the XVIII Century, they adopted the additional surname of Tomacelli, following the acquisition of a fief of that name in Calabria. At much the same time, 1705, Philip V of Spain created the Neapolitan title, in their favour, of Duke di Monasterace. In 1880, Domenico Perelli Tomacelli married the heiress of the Filomarino family and added her name to his.

As a result of this marriage, he inherited in 1887, all the titles of the senior branch of the Filomarino family, one of the oldest in Naples. These new honours included Duke della Torre and Teverolaccio, Duke della Torre a Mare, Duke di Cutrofiano, etc. In 1724, they had already inherited, from the family di Costanzo, the title of Prince di Colle d'Anchise (which had been created in 1627) and which was then transferred to the title of Prince of Boiano.

The Filomarino titles all passed on, with the rule that they were to apply on the basis of male primogeniture. Junior members of the family are addressed as don or donna.

Duke of Monasterace (1705), Duke of Torre and of Teverolaccio (1697), Duke of Torre and Mare (1697), Duke of Cutrofiano, Marquis of Salice (1591), Marquis of Campie (1627), Count of Conversano, Noble of Macchia, of Colle of Anchise (1625) and Guagnano.
